Project Updates from the Jasper Quarry

The Jasper quarry is located in what I consider a logistical bottleneck, with truck transportation serving as the only means of shipping product. When the CHS elevator closed and L. G. Everist acquired the property, it helped alleviate that bottleneck. This acquisition provides us with the opportunity to bring rail service to the site, creating a more efficient shipping option, while also giving us ample space for additional product stockpiles.

It continues to be a busy production season at Jasper. From stripping and blasting on the east side of the quarry to reach our extraction limits, to the many projects underway in our dimension stone operation, our crew has been hard at work.

One project we're especially excited to be part of is the Jacobson Plaza at the Falls, which includes Everist Park. We have been supplying boulders for landscaping, outcroppings, and dimension stone for the overlook above the falls. It's rewarding to see this area transformed into a beautiful destination where people can gather, relax, and enjoy the view.
